<u>Woodbridge</u> (Wylie) 972-429-5100 7400 Country Club Dr. Drive the Geo Bush Turnpike, exit at Hwy 78 (north) in Garland. Drive 3.9 miles; turn right into the Woodbridge subdivision. At 2nd stop sign, turn left. Course entrance .2 miles, straight ahead.

Watters Creek (Plano) 972-517-7777; 7201 Chase Oaks Blvd. Drive I-75 (Central Expwy). Exit at Legacy Dr., turn west. At 2nd traffic light, (Chase Oaks Blvd) turn right. Course ½ mile on left.

WestRidge (McKinney) 972-346-2212; 9055 Cotton Ridge Road North. Take I-75 north to McKinney, exit at Virginia Pkwy. Turn left (west) and drive 5.5 miles to Custer Rd. (FM 2478); turn left (south) for ½ mile, course entrance on right.

<u>Luna Vista</u> (Dallas) 214-670-6322; 11223 Luna Rd. Drive to I-35E (Stemmons Frwy). Exit at Royal Lane. Drive west 1.1 miles (traffic light). Turn left (Luna Rd.), drive .4 mile, course entrance on right.

<u>G.C. of Dallas</u> (Dallas) 214-333-3595; 2200 W. Redbird Ln. From downtown Dallas, drive south on I-35E. Approx 4.4 miles, bear right onto Hwy 67 (towards Cleburne). In approx. 2.2 miles, exit at Hampton Rd. Turn left (under Hwy 67). At 2nd traffic light (Red Bird Ln.) turn left, course entrance .1 mile on right.

2014 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2014 Open Championship was played over the Royal Liverpool links course in Hoylake, England. Players found the course to be lush, green and the greens receptive to approach shots similar to conditions usually found in the U.S. Hard, brown, fast fairways were not to be found on Day 1 played under warm, sunny skies. Rory McIlroy took advantage of the ideal conditions, carding a sizzling 66 to lead the 156 player field by 1 stroke over his nearest pursuer, Matteo Manassero. Seventeen NTSGA members were thrilled as they selected McIlroy as one half of their selection combo's for this year's British Open.

Day 2 opened with similar benign weather conditions and Rory McIlroy continued his strong play, again posting a 66 and enjoyed a 4 stroke advantage over Dustin Johnson and a 6 stroke advantage over Rickie Fowler and Sergio Garcia. The 3 favorite selections of NTSGA members for this years' Open Championship were Adam Scott, Justin Rose and Rory McIlroy. Sadly, six NTSGA members were knocked out of the pot as their selected golfers missed the cut. These players included Lee Westwood, Ian Poulter, Miguel Angel Jimenez, Bubba Watson, Fredrick Jacobson, Patrick Reed and Webb Simpson.

The R & A made an unusual decision because of forecast inclement weather for the 3rd round, when they had the golfers tee off #1 and #10 in threesomes. The hottest golfer of the day was Rickie Fowler who actually tied Rory McIlroy on the back nine at 14 under par through 13 holes. NTSGA members **Clint Culp** and **Jack Thompson** were excited as they selected Fowler as one of their Pot selections. However, a few bogies by Fowler and 2 birdies and 2 eagles in the closing 5 holes by McIlroy, thrust him into a commanding 6 stroke lead at the end of the day.

Weather conditions for the final round were beautiful with no wind and plenty of sunshine. Sergio Garcia's good play early in the round vaulted him into second position behind McIlroy. McIlroy, Garcia, Fowler, Dustin Johnson and Robert Karlsson were all selected by NTSGA golfers and all fighting for the lead. Terrific shotmaking by all golfers provided riveting golf for spectators and television viewers. Several golfers made runs at the lead, but no one could catch eventual winner, Rory McIlroy.

Finishing as runner up in the NTSGA Pot was **Bill Rogers**: Adam Scott (T5) and Sergio Garcia (T2) and there was a 5 way tie for first as all the winners selected: Rory McIlroy (1) and Adam Scott (T5). The five winners, splitting \$345.00 were **Russ Medlin**, **Jim Rowley**, **Jay Bradford**, **Paul Price and Joel Rogers**. **CONGRATULATIONS**, **GENTLEMEN!**

The next majors' Pot (PGA Championship) will be open for selection at Woodbridge, Aug. 6.

WATCH THE KIDS.....

FUN FORMAT.....

In an attempt to allow members to get acquainted with other members, we will play a Shamble format during the WestRidge tournament on Aug. 20. Each team will consist of 4 players based on handicaps (A, B,C & D). The teams will be randomly selected on Aug 18 after the field is set and scorecards will be prepared by Board Members to be used at this event.

This is a onetime event where gross scores will be recorded and flight payout winners, two man team competition and skins will be computed as usual. Prize money will be awarded to the top 3 teams for the Shamble competition.

PREVENTING SLOW PLAY.....

- If your group is 1 hole behind, the entire foursome is very close to a violation.
- If your group is 2 holes behind, the entire foursome is ripe for penalty strokes.
- If the Marshal warns a group once and a second visit shows no improvement, a 2 stroke penalty will be imposed for all players. Additional warnings will result in another 2 stroke penalty.
- If a scorecard is turned in, in excess of 45 minutes after the first "B" group scorecard was submitted, the entire foursome will be disqualified.

Please join me in remembering a great icon of the entertainment community:


The Pillsbury Doughboy died yesterday of a yeast infection and trauma complications from repeatedly being poked in the belly. He was 71.

Aunt Jemima delivered the eulogy and lovingly described Doughboy as a man who never knew how much he was kneaded. Born and bread in Minnesota, Doughboy rose quickly in show business, but his later life was filled with turnovers.
