# **DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES**

<u>Indian Creek</u> (Carrollton) 972-466-9850; 1650 W. Frankford. Drive north on I-35E (Stemmons Frwy). Under the George Bush Turnpike flyover, exit at Frankford Rd. Follow the road as it turns right, drive .6 mile, course entrance on left.

<u>Hackberry Creek C.C.</u> (Irving) 972-869-2631; 1901 W. Royal Ln. Drive the George Bush Turnpike (west/south). Take the 1<sup>st</sup> exit after passing over the LBJ Frwy (Royal Lane/Hwy 114/Gateway Dr.) After exiting, make a quick right turn onto the street that has a small sign that reads Royal Lane, just prior to new construction. Turn right and follow the road to the stop sign, then turn right again. Drive .2 mile, course entrance on right.

Golf Club of Dallas (Dallas) 214-333-3595; 2200 W. Redbird Ln. From downtown Dallas, drive south on I-35E. Approx 4.4 miles, bear right onto Hwy 67 (towards Cleburne). In approx. 2.2 miles, exit at Hampton Rd. Turn left (under Hwy 67). At 2<sup>nd</sup> traffic light (Red Bird Ln.) turn left, course entrance .1 mile on right.

<u>Riverside</u> (Grand Prairie) 817-640-7800; 3000 Riverside Pkwy. Take the George Bush Turnpike west/south towards Arlington. Exit at Hwy 183, drive west 1.9 miles and turn onto Hwy 360 south. Drive 1.9 miles, exit at Riverside Pkwy, course entrance on right.

<u>Brookhaven C.C.</u> (Farmers Branch) 972-243-6151; 3333 Golfing Green Dr. Drive I-635 (LBJ Frwy). During construction look for small orange and black signs showing street exits. Exit at Marsh Ln. and turn north. Drive 1 mile to Brookhaven Club Dr. (traffic light). Turn left. Drive .4 mile to stop sign. (Golfing Green Dr.) Turn right, drive past tennis courts. Turn right into club parking lot.

<u>Buffalo Creek</u> (Rockwall) 972-771-4003; 624 Country Club Dr. Take LBJ Frwy east/south, exit at I-30 east. Go across lake, exit at Horizon Rd. Turn right, drive across Ridge Rd (traffic light). Immediately past hospital, turn right onto Tubbs Rd. (7-11 on left). Road changes name to White Rd. Wind through residential area adjacent to golf course. Turn left at dead end (Country Club Rd.) Drive ¼ mile, course entrance on right.

Stonebriar C.C. (Frisco) 972-625-8916; 5050 Country Club Dr. Drive north on the Dallas Tollway. Exit at Legacy, turn left (Legacy goes west and then turns north). Drive under Hwy 121 and proceed .4 mile, make a left turn at Country Club Dr. and drive 200 yds. into parking lot. Club on left.

<u>Tangleridge</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-299-6837; 818 Tangle Ridge Dr. Take I-35E south thru downtown Dallas. Bear right at the Hwy 67 split, towards Cleburne. After passing under I-20, drive 8.7 miles, exit at Lake Ridge Pkwy., right turn (2 miles). Turn left at Park Ridge Dr., follow signs to golf course.



#### **RULES CLARIFICATION...**

In an attempt to keep play moving, NTSGA has modified USGA rules to avoid having a player walk back to the tee box after hitting a ball out of bounds

Similarly, if a ball is hit into a hazard, a ball may be dropped sideways within 2 club lengths of where it crossed the hazard boundry, or anywhere along the line back to the teeing ground. Penalty: 1 stroke. A ball may not be dropped within 2 club lengths from the hazard boundry where the ball splashed into a hazard (lake).

# 2014 U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP POT

The U.S. Open Championship got underway on a sunny, windless day as 156 golfers teed off in Round 1. The course resembled a links venue with brown fairways, waste areas with natural grasses coupled with turtle back greens that would potentially cause the best players in the world, many problems. What the USGA hadn't planned on was rain on Wednesday night that would make the greens softer and much more receptive to approach shots. NTSGA golfer's favorite overall picks to win this Championship were Phil Mickelson, Bubba Watson, Adam Scott, Jordan Spieth, Rory McIlroy and Matt Kuchar. After Day 1, the large field of golfers were all chasing Marin Kaymer, who recorded a brilliant 65 to lead by 3 strokes much to the delight of 5 NTSGA golfers who had picked him as ½ of their selection combo.

Day 2 started after overnight rains allowed the greens to remain soft and let the golfers shoot at the flagsticks, which is not what the USGA wanted. Martin Kaymer shot a second consecutive round of 65 which was the lowest two round score (130) in PGA tour history for a U.S. Open. After 2 rounds, Kaymer lead the field by 6 strokes. Many NTSGA members were encouraged as their selections of Dustin Johnson, Henrik Stenson, Matt Kuchar, Rory McIlroy and Adam Scott were close to the top of the leaderboard. An equal number of NTSGA golfers were disappointed as their selection of Bubba Watson, Luke Donald, Jason Dufner, Hunter Mahan and Angel Cabrera missed the cut, knocking 37 NTSGA members out of the running to win the U.S. Open Pot.

The USGA was obviously disappointed that the course was not playing as hard as they would like, so no water was applied Friday night in an attempt to further test the golfer's skills on a hardened, faster course. Their strategy obviously worked as many players talked about how tough the course played on Saturday. Rickie Fowler played a flawless round, passing many players to position himself in 2<sup>nd</sup> place beginning Sunday's final round. Martin Kaymer still led the field by 5 strokes starting Sunday's play. It was definitely Martin Kaymer's tournament, as he led from start to finish and bested the next closest players (Rickie Fowler and Eric Compton) by 8 strokes to win this year's U.S. Open Championship.

Runners up to win the NTSGA U.S. Open Pot were **Bobby Wood** who selected Matt Kuchar (T12) & Jason Day (T4) and **Jim Yarbrough** picking Matt Kuchar (T12) & Dustin Johnson (T4). The overall winners splitting \$425.00 were **Bill Roll**; Martin Kaymer (1) & Justin Rose (T12) and **Roger Ball**; Dustin Johnson (T4) & Adam Scott (9).

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING....**

Here are recent changes voted on by the Board of Directors:

- 1. We will play the ball down (summer rules) at the Stonebriar C.C. tournament, July 28. See note on page 1 of this newsletter.
- 2. The tee markers on all par 3's will be together at a distance determined by the Tournament Chairman. All players will tee off from the same distance on all par 3 holes.
- 3. If you no-show a tournament or cancel after the deadline (noon, 2 days prior), you will incur a 2 event suspension.
- 4. In an attempt to allow members to get acquainted with other members, we will play a different format, other than stroke play, for one tournament this year. Tentative date for that event is August 20 at WestRidge.
- 5. Players over age 75 with a handicap of 16+ may participate in <u>either</u> the over 16 handicap skins pot or the over age 75 skins pot. This does not affect the tees that should be used dependent on age.
