DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

<u>Pecan Hollow</u> (Plano) 972-941-7600; 4501 E. 14th St. Drive the Geo. Bush Turnpike, exit east of Central Expy (I-75) at Jupiter. Drive north for 1 mile, turn right on 14th street and drive 2.3 miles. Course entrance on left.

<u>Waterview</u> (Rowlett) 972-463-8900; 9509 Waterview Pkwy. Drive the Geo. Bush Turnpike east through Garland, past hwy 78. Exit at Merritt/Liberty Grove Connector. At <u>2nd</u> stop sign (Liberty Grove), turn left. Drive 1.7 miles. Turn left at Waterview Pkwy, leads to golf course on left. If driving through downtown Dallas on I-30, proceed east of LBJ Frwy (635), Garland, and exit at Geo Bush Turnpike (north). Exit the Turnpike at Lakeview Pkwy/Main St. /Hwy 66. Stay on the Service Road, passing Main St., passing Hwy 66 for another 1.4 miles. Turn right at the stop sign (Liberty Grove). Drive 1.7 miles. Turn left at Waterview Pkwy, leads to golf course on left.

Heritage Ranch C.C. (Fairview) 972-549-0276; 465 Scenic Ranch Circle. Take I-75 (Central Expwy) north, exit at Stacy Rd., right turn (east) 3 miles to the dead end (FM 1378). Turn left, then an immediate right, back onto Stacy Rd. Continue east for ½ mile, course entrance on left (has gate guard).

WEEKLY FEES:

Golf courses around the Metroplex have been inundated with flooding problems during the months of May/June and also recently in November. These high water levels are causing course closures, shutdowns and cancellations to the point where the golf courses are increasing their daily and tournament fees to offset the down time caused by lake/river flooding. Tournament Chairman, **Rod Wells** is learning of these increased tournament fees as he prepares our 2016 schedule. For this reason, the Board of Directors has voted to increase our weekly tournament fees to \$50.00. Last year the Board voted to raise the annual dues to \$60.00 in an attempt to offset these higher course fees, but find that additional money is necessary to counteract the raising of weekly fees from Dallas/Ft. Worth golf facilities. If this increase in weekly fees proves to be more than satisfactory to offset the increased course fees, our By-Laws have explicit methods to return excess monies to its members.

Thank you for your understanding in this change of weekly tournament fees for 2016.
