DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

July 1 <u>Lantana</u> (Lantana) 940-728-4653; 800 Golf Club Dr. Drive north on I-35E (Stemmons Frwy) past Lewisville. Exit at FM407 (Justin Road) Exit #454A. Follow small sign to FM407 <u>west</u>, back over top of I-35E and continue west for 6.2 miles. Turn right at Lantana Trail (traffic light); drive 1.2 miles (divided road), turn right at Golf Club Dr., leads to clubhouse.

July 8 <u>Waterview</u> (Rowlett) 972-463-8900; 9509 Waterview Pkwy. Drive the Geo. Bush Turnpike east through Garland, past hwy 78. Exit at Merritt/Liberty Grove Connector. At <u>2nd</u> stop sign (Liberty Grove), turn left. Drive 1.7 miles. Turn left at Waterview Pkwy, leads to golf course on left. If driving through downtown Dallas on I-30, proceed east of LBJ Frwy (635), Garland, and exit at Geo Bush Turnpike (north). Exit the Turnpike at Lakeview Pkwy/Main St./Hwy 66. Stay on the Service Road, passing Main St., passing Hwy 66 for another 1.4 miles. Turn right at the stop sign (Liberty Grove). Drive 1.7 miles. Turn left at Waterview Pkwy, leads to golf course on left.

July 15 <u>Watters Creek</u> (Plano) 972-517-7777; 7201 Chase Oaks Blvd. Drive I-75 (Central Expwy). Exit at Legacy Dr., turn west. At 2nd traffic light, (Chase Oaks Blvd) turn right. Course ½ mile on left.

July 20 <u>Stonebriar C.C.</u> (Frisco) 972-625-8916; 5050 Country Club Dr. Drive north on the Dallas Tollway. Exit at Legacy, turn left (Legacy goes west and then turns north). Drive under Hwy 121 and proceed .4 mile, make a left turn at Country Club Dr. and drive 200 yds. into parking lot. Club on left.

July 22 <u>Buffalo Creek</u> (Rockwall) 972-771-4003; 624 Country Club Dr. Take LBJ Frwy east/south, exit at I-30 east. Go across lake, exit at Horizon Rd. Turn right, drive across Ridge Rd (traffic light). Immediately past hospital, turn right onto Tubbs Rd. (7-11 store on left). Road changes name to White Rd. Wind through residential area adjacent to golf course. Turn left at dead end (Country Club Rd.) Drive ½ mile, course entrance on right.

July 29 <u>Tangleridge</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-299-6837; 818 Tangle Ridge Dr. Take I-35E south thru downtown Dallas. Bear right at the Hwy 67 split, towards Cleburne. After passing under I-20, drive 8.7 miles, exit at Lake Ridge Pkwy., right turn (2 miles). Turn left at Park Ridge Dr., follow signs through residential area to golf course.

DID YOU KNOW?

Patrick Wills, a 59 year old golfer from Virginia had an unbelievable round of golf recently, witnessed by his two sons and an Air Force friend. Wills' scorecard reflected 1 eagle, 7 birdies and 3 holes-in-one, for a round of 57. He aced the 289 yard, par 4, 7th hole, then made a hole-in-one at the 10th hole, a 334 yard, par 4. He made his 3rd ace at the 187 yard, par 3, 14th hole. The course pro at Laurel Hill Golf Club in Lorton, Virginia verified Wills scorecard and said the odds of 3 holes-in-one in a single round is 1 in the billions.

Wills has now made 25 holes-in-one in his career, but none will be as memorable as the 3 he made in one round.

U.S. OPEN POT

The 2015 U.S. Open was played at Chambers Bay Golf Club in University Place, Washington. It was a course unlike the typical well-manicured country club courses that the PGA tour players are accustomed. This was a links course with hardened, undefined fairways, large sand bunkers and penalizing tall grasses. The overwhelming favorite of all the NTSGA members was naturally, Jordan Spieth, since he is a Dallas native, attended local schools and would try to win back to back major championships. The opening round scores were high as players continually hit balls in penalizing positions or into runoff areas where many balls rolled through the slick greens into deep sand traps. Surprisingly, Henrik Stenson and Dustin Johnson led the field of players both shooting 5 under par. Close behind were Jordan Spieth and his UT college teammate, Cody Gribble recording 68's (3 strokes off the pace). Forty eight NTSGA members were excited as one half of their combo selection was Jordan Spieth.

Day 2 began with clear blue skies and beautiful views of Puget Sound from the golf course. Scores continued to skyrocket as golfers had a difficult time judging the correct place on the quirky greens to hit the ball and keep it from rolling into the many bunkers. The rugged terrain took its toll on two players as Gary Woodland was admitted to the hospital suffering from dehydration and Jason Day suffered from BPPV (Benign Paroxysmal Positional Vertigo) and had to be helped off the golf course following completion of his round after he collapsed on the 18th green. NTSGA members, **Art Krueger**, **Joe Bob Wheeler**, **Mike Vestal**, **Gene Lindsey and Randy Cook** were hopeful that treatment given to Jason Day during the evening would be successful as Day was one of their selections. Play on Day 2 concluded with Jordan Spieth and fellow Ryder Cup teammate, Patrick Reed leading the way, both at 5 under par. The happiest of all NTSGA golfers was **Gene Kurihara**, as his Pot selections were both Reed and Spieth.

After receiving overnight treatment, Jason Day played superb golf on Day 3 and tied Spieth, along with Dustin Johnson and Brandon Grace. All were tied at the top at 4 under par. Many NTSGA golfers were disappointed as half of their selections failed to make the cut including Bubba Watson, Martin Kaymer, Ryan Moore and Ricky Fowler.

Beginning Day 4, large crowds greeted the golfers as spectators were ready to root for their favorite players in hopes of him capturing the U.S. Open silver cup. Louis Oosthuizen made a surge for the tournament lead by recording 6 straight birdies. Adam Scott also made a strong move by shooting the low round of the tournament (64). However, none of the golfers could catch Jordan Spieth especially when he birdied 16 to take a 3 stroke lead. Unfortunately, he gave away 2 strokes by double bogeying 17 and opening the door for Dustin Johnson. Putting for eagle on 18 for the win or birdie for a tie, Johnson 3 putted and the U.S. Open title belonged to Jordan Spieth.

The runner up to this year's NTSGA U.S. Open pot was **Bob Coburn**: Jordan Spieth (1) and Adam Scott (T4). The overall winners were **Randy Cook, Ollie Cromwell and Joe Minter**. All 3 members selected Jordan Spieth (1) and Dustin Johnson (T2). Each split the pot of \$485.00.
