DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

<u>Grapevine</u> (Grapevine) 817-410-3377; 3800 Fairway Dr. Take LBJ Frwy west, towards DFW airport. Prior to the airport entry, exit at Bass Pro Dr., continue to the traffic light. Turn left, drive over Hwy 121, past the Embassy Suites Hotel to the next traffic light (Hwy 26). Turn left, drive ½ mile to next traffic light, turn right (Fairway Dr.) Drive past Cowboys Golf Club and over the Lake Grapevine Dam. On the other side of the Dam, turn right into golf course entrance.

<u>Stone Creek</u> (Sherman) 903-870-7980; 2200 Club House Dr. Drive north on I-75 (Central Expy) towards Sherman, TX. Take Exit #57 (Park St.) Turn left under the freeway and south on the west side service road. Course entrance is on right.

Luna Vista (Dallas) 214-670-6322; 11223 Luna Rd. Drive to I-35E (Stemmons Frwy). Exit at Royal Lane. Drive west 1.1 miles (traffic light). Turn left (Luna Rd.), drive .4 mile, course entrance on right

<u>Hurricane Creek</u> (Anna) 972-924-3247; 1800 Fairway Lane. Take I-75 (Central Expwy) north, exit at Anna (Truck Stop), turn left go over I-75, right turn onto the west service road, drive 1.7 miles (north). Left turn at small sign, leads to club.

- 1) Don't walk on another players putting line when on the green. (You wouldn't appreciate it!).
- 2) Rake the sand traps after hitting your shot. (You don't want to hit an errant shot into a sand trap only to find footprints everywhere left by previous golfers).
- 3) Keep carts on paths when close to greens and tee boxes (This only makes sense!).
- 4) Please enter names and scores on card in a legible manner to help Treasurer, **Pete Schoemann** and Handicap Chairman, **Howie Bacharach** (To prevent incorrect tabulations!).
- 5) Don't' spit on the greens. (It's disgusting!).
- 6) Put sand in fairway divots and repair ball marks on the greens. (It helps the greenskeeper care for the course).
- 7) Keep play moving by playing "Ready Golf". Don't hit into the foursome ahead, but be ready to hit once they are driving away from their fairway shots.

NTSGA has a good reputation throughout the Metroplex golf courses. Please uphold this reputation by observing simple common sense courtesies as we are being observed by pro shop personnel and marshals.....Thank You.

2015 MASTERS POT...

This year's Masters opened on Thursday under beautiful weather conditions and would be Ben Crenshaw's final time to play the course as a member of the field. Tiger Woods would play in this event after staying away from competitive golf for over 2 months. The most popular selection to win this tournament by NTSGA golfers was Dallas' own Jordan Spieth. The 21 year old graduate of Jesuit College Prep school spent one year at the University of Texas, leading his college team to the National Championship. It was understandable why 41 NTSGA members selected Spieth as one half of their selection combo because of his stellar record over the past 4 months. He won the Hero World Challenge (Florida), finished 4th at Riviera (Los Angeles), won the Valspar Championship (Florida), finished 2nd at the Valero Texas Open (San Antonio) and finished 2nd at the Shell Houston Open (Houston). In addition to Jordan Spieth, NTSGA members were counting on good Master's finishes by Dustin Johnson, Phil Mickelson, Bubba Watson, Rory McIlroy and Patrick Reed. Surely, with so many members selecting Spieth, this would probably result in a split pot.

After Day 1, Spieth set the pace for all the other golfers recording 9 birdies and only 1 shot off the tournament record for an opening round at Augusta National. His closest pursuers were Ernie Els, Jason Day, Justin Rose and Charlie Hoffman. The most excited NTSGA member was **Paul Price**, as he selected Jordan Spieth and Jason Day as his selections.

Day 2 weather conditions were exactly like the sunny conditions of Day 1 and Spieth increased his lead over the field by 5 strokes, recording 66. Dustin Johnson continued to climb the leader board making 3 eagles during the day, a tournament record. NTSGA members that were very encouraged at their chances of capturing the Masters Pot included **Joel Rogers, Tom McMahan, Ollie Cromwell, Al Alcantara, Bobby Wood and Mike Vestal.**

Unfortunately, several NTSGA members would not compete since one or both of their golfers failed to make the cut. These NTSGA members included **Jim Yarbrough**, **Pat Tritch**, **Steve Tipton**, **Joe Thompson**, **John Owens**, **Jerry Walker**, **Bob Trainham and Gerald Gotcher**.

Day 3 began with Jordan Spieth leading by 5 strokes and he increased his lead to 7 at one point. Phil Mickelson, Tiger Woods and Roy McIlroy played well, but by the end of the day still trailed Spieth by 5 & 10 strokes respectively. Justin Rose made 5 birdies in 6 holes and vaulted into 2nd place ahead of Charlie Hoffman and Phil Mickelson. Spieth made a beautiful birdie on 16, then slipped a little on 17, but recovered with a miraculous par on 18. Rose still trailed Spieth by 4 strokes at the end of Day 3. His total of 200 strokes after 3 rounds established a new 54 hole record for the Masters tournament. Thirty seven NTSGA members were still hopeful that Jordan Spieth would close out the tournament with a win and that their other selection finished near the top.

The final round of this year's Masters began under overcast skies with Jordan Spieth leading the field by 4 strokes. He increased his lead to 6 as he began playing the back 9. During the day he established many new Masters Records as he led the tournament from start to finish winning by 4 strokes.

Runners-up to the NTSGA Masters Pot were **Chris Haas, Kelly Parks, Johnny Russo, Bill Roll, Bob Trainham and Howie Bacharach**, all having selected Jordan Spieth (1) & Rory McIlroy (4). The pot was split 3 ways as all 3 members selected Jordan Spieth (1) & Phil Mickelson (T2). The winners were **Joel Rogers, Mike Vestal and Ollie Cromwell.** Each member pocketed \$148.00. The next Major tournament pot selection will be the US Open, on June 17 at Heritage Ranch C.C.
