### **DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURESES**

Aug. 2 <u>Tangleridge</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-299-6837; 818 Tangle Ridge Dr. Take I-35E south thru downtown Dallas. Bear right at the Hwy 67 split, towards Cleburne. After passing under I-20, drive 8.7 miles, exit at Lake Ridge Pkwy., right turn (2 miles). Turn left at Park Ridge Dr., follow signs through residential area to golf course. Or, drive south on the George Bush Turnpike through Arlington towards I-20. Exit at Lake Ridge Parkway (the exit before I-20) and continue south for approx 8.5 miles. Still on Lake Ridge Pkwy., turn right at entrance to the Tangleridge housing area. Drive approx. 1.2 miles (past elementary school). Turn right at Park Ridge Ct. (Leads to golf course).

Aug. 9 <u>Riverchase</u> (Coppell) 972-462-8281; 700 Riverchase Dr. Drive to I-35E and Belt Line Rd. (Farmers Branch). Turn west and drive 2.2 miles to Fairway Drive (traffic light). Turn right. Drive to stop sign. Turn right, course entrance on right.

Aug. 14 <u>Gleneagles C.C.</u> (Plano) 972-867-8888; 5401 W. Park Blvd. Drive north on the Dallas North Tollway. Exit at W. Park Blvd. (FM 544). Turn right for 1.2 miles, course entrance on left.

Aug. 16 <u>Texas Star</u> (Euless) 817-685-7888; 1400 Texas Star Pkwy. Take Hwy 183 (Airport Frwy) west, past the south entrance to DFW Airport. Exit at Hwy 10 West (it becomes Euless Blvd.) Continue on Hwy 10, passing Hwy 157 (Industrial Blvd.) for 1 more mile. Course entrance on left.

Aug. 23 <u>Lantana</u> (Lantana) 940-728-4653; 800 Golf Club Dr. Drive north on I-35E (Stemmons Frwy) past Lewisville. Exit at FM407 (Justin Road) Exit #454A. At the traffic, turn left and continue west for 6.2 miles. Turn right at Lantana Trail (water tower and traffic light); drive 1.2 miles (divided road), turn right at Golf Club Dr., leads to clubhouse.

Aug. 30 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2 ½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2<sup>nd</sup> exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.

### 2017 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP POT

OMG! What a golf tournament. Just about the time the representative from Dallas looked like his efforts were not good enough....he flipped the switch and went birdie, eagle, birdie, birdie and gave the spectators and the national TV audience a golf experience they will never forget.

The Open Championship, being played at Royal Birkdale in northwest England, opened under cold, windy conditions. Patrons were bundled up with stocking caps, gloves and hoodies as the world's finest golfers would be tested under pretty harsh weather conditions. The afternoon tee times fared a little better as the overcast skies gave way to sunshine. Jordan Spieth, Brooks Koepka and Matt Kuchar were tied for the lead after Round 1 as all three golfers recorded sparkling 65's. These three golfers were the favorites of 33 selections made by NTSGA golfers. Now were the members able to pair them up with another golfer who played good golf and capture the 2017 British Open Pot? The most popular pro's selected by NTSGA golfers were Dustin Johnson, Jon Rahm, Jordan Spieth, Hideki Matsuyama and Rickie Fowler.

Day 2 produced weather conditions more appropriate for Open Championship play as wind and rain became factors. Jordan Spieth maintained a 2 shot lead over Matt Kuchar after the round to the delight of 25 NTSGA members' selections. Thirty three NTSGA members, however, were disappointed as one or both of their selections missed the cut including Phil Mickelson, Louis Oosthuizen, Justin Thomas and Patrick Reed.

Day 3 weather was very mild with no wind as golfers and spectators were in short sleeved shirts. The hottest round of the day turned out to be a 62 recorded by Brandon Grace. This was the lowest score ever recorded in major tournament history. One NTSGA member, **Dick Fryer** had selected Grace as one half of his combo selection. The R & A moved the tee boxes forward and that coupled with the mild weather conditions, the pro's put on a display of golf that has never been seen before in major championships. Forty three players recorded rounds in the 60's. The loudest cheers in the Metroplex were coming from **Gene Edmondson's** home as he was sitting on a Spieth/Kuchar combination and they were positioned at #1 & #2 at the end of Round 3.

The final round of the 2017 Open Championship began under beautiful sunny skies but turned cloudy and rainy for the afternoon golfers. Jordan Spieth maintained a 3 shot lead over Matt Kuchar to begin the round, however, Spieth made bogey in 3 out of the first 4 holes and soon he and Kuchar were tied at the top of the leaderboard. After 13 holes Matt Kuchar moved into the lead of the Open Championship by one stroke over Spieth. After making bogey at 13, Spieth went 5 under on the remaining 5 holes and vaulted back into the lead by 2 strokes. An easy par on 18 and Jordan Spieth was the Champion Golfer of the Year. The runner-up in this years' NTSGA British Open Pot was **Dick Hall**: Jordan Spieth (1) & Rafael Cabrera-Bello (T4).

The overall winner of this years' NTSGA British Open Pot was **Gene Edmondson**: Jordan Spieth (1) & Matt Kuchar (2). Gene pockets \$435.00.

#### **SLOW PLAY-**

Slow play is defined as any foursome that is not keeping up with the foursome ahead of them. This is regardless of whether the group ahead of them is waiting. One issue that the Board of Directors suspects is slowing play is the extended use of on course laser range finders. If required to keep carts on paths during wet conditions, take several clubs to your ball along with the range finder to avoid making two separate trips.

These tips will also help speed the pace of play:

- Don't take 4 practice swings before striking the ball; you warmed up on the driving range.
- Don't wait until it's your turn to put to determine which way your put breaks. You should've done that when walking onto the green or while others are putting.
- Play ready golf, even in the fairway.
- Walk briskly to/from the green
