NTSGA RULES REFRESHER..... IMPROVING YOUR LIE.

You may use the longest club in your bag to improve your lie up to 1 club length, no closer to the hole. You cannot use your club, foot or hands to build a lie by roughing or raising the turf or mashing down the turf behind the ball. You cannot improve your lie in a hazard. You may play a ball from a hazard without grounding your club (no penalty stroke), or lift the ball from the hazard and dropping within 2 club lengths from the hazard line where the ball entered the hazard, incurring a 1 stroke penalty. Or, you may drop the ball anywhere on the extended line from where the ball entered the hazard back to the teeing ground, also incurring a 1 stroke penalty.

DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

July 5 <u>Lantana</u> (Lantana) 940-728-4653; 800 Golf Club Dr. Drive north on I-35E (Stemmons Frwy) past Lewisville. Exit at FM407 (Justin Road) Exit #454A. At the traffic, turn left and continue west for 6.2 miles. Turn right at Lantana Trail (water tower and traffic light); drive 1.2 miles (divided road), turn right at Golf Club Dr., leads to clubhouse.

July 12 <u>Stone Creek</u> (Sherman) 903-870-7980; 2200 Club House Dr. Drive north on I-75 (Central Expy) towards Sherman, TX. Take Exit #57 (Park St.) Turn left under the freeway and south on the west side service road. Course entrance is on right.

July 19 <u>Grapevine</u> (Grapevine) 817-410-3377; 3800 Fairway Dr. Take LBJ Frwy west, towards DFW airport. Prior to the airport entry, exit at Bass Pro Dr., continue to the traffic light. Turn left, drive over Hwy 121, past the Embassy Suites Hotel to the next traffic light (Hwy 26). Turn left, drive ½ mile to next traffic light, turn right (Fairway Dr.) Drive past Cowboys Golf Club and over the Lake Grapevine Dam. On the other side of the Dam, turn right into golf course entrance.

July 26 Watters Creek (Plano) 972-517-7777; 7201 Chase Oaks Blvd. Drive I-75 (Central Expwy). Exit at Legacy Dr., turn west. At 2nd traffic light, (Chase Oaks Blvd) turn right. Course ½ mile on left.

Aug. 2 <u>Tangleridge</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-299-6837; 818 Tangle Ridge Dr. Take I-35E south thru downtown Dallas. Bear right at the Hwy 67 split, towards Cleburne. After passing under I-20, drive 8.7 miles, exit at Lake Ridge Pkwy., right turn (2 miles). Turn left at Park Ridge Dr., follow signs through residential area to golf course. Or, drive south on the George Bush Turnpike through Arlington towards I-20. Exit at Lake Ridge Parkway (the exit before I-20) and continue south for approx 8.5 miles. Still on Lake Ridge Pkwy., turn right at entrance to the Tangleridge housing area. Drive approx. 1.2 miles (past elementary school). Turn right at Park Ridge Ct. (Leads to golf course).

2017 U.S. OPEN POT....

The 2017 U.S. Open was played for the very first time in the state of Wisconsin, northwest of Milwaukee. Played over the Erin Hills links monster course stretched out to 7845 yards, the forecast was for rain on several days during this event. The overwhelming favorites selected by NTSGA members were Dustin Johnson, Jason Day, Jordan Spieth and Jon Rahm. Rickie Fowler led the field after Day1 shooting a sparkling 65 followed by Paul Casey, Xander Schauffele and Brooks Koepka. Many of the pre-tournament favorites hit too many balls in the tall fescue grass and could be in jeopardy of missing the cut.

Day 2 began under nice weather conditions again, but the big names could not stay out of the tall rough and missed the cut. The world's top 3 golfers (Dustin Johnson, Rory McIlroy and Jason Day) all missed the cut, thereby ending the possibilities of 74 NTSGA member's selections of winning this years' U.S. Open Pot. Excitement was coming from the households of **Bob Wood, Roger Ball, Jerry Walker, Ollie Cromwell and Paul Price** as their combo picks had good chances of winning this year's Pot. Saturday is called moving day and Jordan Spieth needed to make a strong move if he was going to be in contention for Sundays final round.

Day 3 weather was relatively calm and birdies were dropping from everywhere. At one point 8 players were tied for the lead. With a forecast for rain and wind, USGA moved the tee boxes forward, but none of the predicted weather arrived. Bright sunshine gave way to overcast conditions and the pro's put on a thrilling day of golf for the many spectators. Justin Thomas shot 63, the lowest score against par in U.S. Open history. He trailed Brian Harman the wee left hander from Sea Island, Georgia (#50 in world rankings) by only one stroke. 32 players recorded rounds under par.....a U.S. Open record. Seven NTSGA members had selected Justin Thomas, but did their 2nd player in the combo pick finish high enough to win this year's U.S. Open Pot? **Mike Vestal, Dale Hager, Jack Thompson, Basil Greaves, Mike Robertson and Dick Hall** all had possibilities and were rooting for their selections to have hot rounds on Day 4. Sunday's final round promised to be a shootout.

The weather that was forecast all week, never materialized. Day 4 skies were clear with a mild breeze. Brian Harman began as the leader, but he was soon caught and passed by Brooks Koepka. The big hitter was accurate off the tee and precise with his putts, winning the U.S. Open by 4 strokes. This was Koepka's first major tournament win. Runners up to this year's U.S. Open Pot were **Bob Wood, Roger Ball and Jerry Walker** who all selected (Sergio Garcia T-21 & Hideki Matsuyama T-2). The overall winner was **Mike Robertson** (Rickie Fowler T-5 & Steve Stricker T-16). **Mike** pockets \$460.00.
