DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES:

Apr. 3 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2 ½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2nd exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.

Apr. 10 <u>The Tribute</u> (The Colony) 972-370-5465; 1000 Lebanon Rd. From Hwy 121 (Sam Rayburn Tollway) and Josey Ln./Main St./Hwy 423 drive north (through The Colony) for 4.1 miles. At Lebanon (stop light, Walgreens on left) turn left. Drive 3 miles through residential area (pass the Old American Golf Club on the left). At Dead End, turn right into The Tribute parking lot. Or, Drive north on the Dallas Tollway and exit at John Hickman Pkwy/Lebanon Rd. (north of the Sam Rayburn Tollway). At 2nd traffic light (Lebanon Rd.) turn left and drive 4.4 miles crossing Hwy 423. Drive another 3 miles through residential area. At dead end, turn right into course parking lot.

Apr. 17 <u>Watters Creek (Plano)</u> 972-517-7777; 7201 Chase Oaks Blvd. Drive I-75 (Central Expwy). Exit at Legacy Dr., turn west. At 2nd traffic light, (Chase Oaks Blvd) turn right. Course ½ mile on left.

Apr. 24 <u>Prairie Lakes</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-263-0661; 3202 SE 14th St. Drive I-35 southbound, take the Loop 12 split towards Irving. Drive approx. 10 miles south, then take Spur 408 for about 1 ½ miles and make a right turn onto Hwy 303 driving west over Mountain Creek Lake. On the other side of the lake, turn left @ SE 14th St. Course entrance approx. ½ mile on left.

May 1 <u>Thorntree C.C.</u> (Desoto) 972-296-7313; 825 W. Wintergreen Road. Drive south on I-35 through downtown Dallas. Continue south on I-35 past I-20. Exit at Wintergreen road, turn right (west), 3.1 miles. Course entrance on right.

SLOW PLAY.... "CLUB IN, CLUB OUT"

NTSGA is constantly striving for ways to speed up play in hopes of preventing 5-6 hour rounds of golf. With warmer weather approaching, our tournaments will soon have full fields of 128 golfers and it's imperative to keep play moving to keep from playing lengthy rounds. Here is a suggestion given by member, **Ollie Cromwell** to keep play moving during the round to prevent unnecessary delays, "Club in, Club out!" Arrive at your ball in the fairway, hit your shot and immediately get into the cart (still holding onto the club you just hit) and drive to the next shot. When the cart arrives at your next shot, put the club (that you are still holding) into your bag and pull the club you'll need for the next shot. Hit your shot and immediately get into the cart and proceed to your next shot (Club in, Club out). Continue this practice for each hole. If each foursome continues this practice for the entire round, time spent on the golf course will be kept to a minimum and win the approval of all members. Thank you.

LARRY MILTON'S GOLF TIPS FOR STRUGGLING SENIOR GOLFERS:

Chapter 11: How to find that ball that everyone else saw go in the water.

THE MASTERS....FACTS:

There has always been an attraction for golfers towards the hallowed grounds of Augusta National. The Masters is one of the most unusual events in sports. It's all about tradition and it's defined by a set of old rules and customs that just do not exist in other tournaments. Some amateurs have always been invited to the Masters, out of respect for the career of club founder Bobby Jones. However, Jones himself was no longer considered an amateur by the USGA by the time August National opened. He never competed for prize money, but the equipment deals and Hollywood instructional short films made him a professional in the eyes of all, except for the eyes of the Masters hierarchy....of which he was a member.

If you select a pairing that one or both players don't participate, that selection will be voided and money refunded. Payout 1st place: 60%, 2nd place: 25%, 3rd place: 15%.

SAD NEWS:

Longtime NTSGA member, **Tom Lymenstull** passed away March 5, at 90 years of age. He played golf with the Association for 21 years, winning the Club Championship in 2000. Tom was born in Quincy, Illinois attending local schools, graduating from Quincy College in 1950. He proudly served in the U.S. Navy for 6 years whereas he saw action during the Korean War. Upon completion of his military obligation, Tom moved to Dallas and went to work for Texas Instruments designing and manufacturing semi-conductors and integrated circuitry for companies around the world. He later co-founded Optic Electronic Corporation fulfilling defense contracts for the U.S. Dept. of Defense. His company was acquired by Scientific



Holdings of Great Britain and later sold to the Varo Corporation located in Garland. He retired in 1994. During his long tenure with NTSGA, he was our President in 2002 and the Asst. Tournament Chairman for 10 years while serving on the Board of Directors. He resigned from NTSGA in 2017.
