**Pete Schoemann**, the longest tenured member of the North Texas Senior Golf Association is stepping down as our illustrious Treasurer after serving in that position for 18 years. Pete has been a member of the Association for 28 years, joining in 1993.

Growing up in Pennsylvania, Pete graduated from Penn State University earning a Business degree with a major in Accounting. He proudly served our country for 3 years on

active duty and the Reserves in the United States Army. Two and half years were spent on assignment in Germany. Following his military service, Pete went to work for the Atlantic Richfield Company (ARCO) Oil and Gas Company as Auditor and Financial Manager. The company explored, produced and sold oil and natural gas. ARCO was purchased by BP Oil in 2000, becoming one of the world's seven oil/gas supermajors.

Following retirement, Pete stayed busy with his duties as Treasurer for NTSGA and the scorekeeper for Plano middle schools basketball, soccer and volleyball games for over 20 years. In addition, he was the Public Address announcer for Allen High School football games.



# HOLE-IN-ONE, JIM ROWLEY:

Twelve year member Jim Rowley made the Association's  $5^{th}$  Hole-in-one of 2021 on Nov. 2 under rainy conditions at Buffalo Creek. Jim aced the  $4^{th}$  hole playing at 125

yards with his 6 iron witnessed by playing partners Dave Bramlett, Elliott Prater and Bill Roll. This was Jim's 3<sup>rd</sup> hole-in-one all time. He grew up in Columbia, Mississippi attending local schools followed by 6 years of military service, both active duty and reserves in the Army National Guard. Jim ventured into the oil and gas industry successfully conducting petroleum exploration and production operations all over the world for 28 years. Twelve of



those years he worked for the Hunt Oil Company drilling wells on land and offshore in Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, California and Alaska. In addition, he also worked for Enserch Exploration Corporation drilling offshore deep water rigs in the Gulf of Mexico, the North Sea and Mediterranean Sea sometimes to a depth of 7,000 feet. Late in his career, Jim was a consultant on many worldwide independent oil/gas exploration projects.

# By-Laws Article VI, Section 2.....Pay dues, withdraw

Any member paying his tournament fee and commencing play, and who later has to withdraw from the tournament for any reason (DQ'd, illness, injury, WD), shall not be eligible to receive any awarded monies; i.e. flight prize money, 2-man team competition, CTP awards or skins money. If a member pays the entry fee and withdraws before starting the round, no refund shall be given; however, his entry fee will be added to his account balance maintained by the NTSGA Treasurer.
