## **DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES**

Feb. 3 <u>Thorntree</u> (Desoto) 972-296-7313; 825 W. Wintergreen Road. Drive south on I-35 through downtown Dallas. Continue south on I-35 past I-20. Exit at Wintergreen road, turn right (west), 3.1 miles. Course entrance on right.

Feb. 10 <u>Waterview</u> (Rowlett) 972-463-8900; 9509 Waterview Pkwy. Drive the Geo. Bush Turnpike east through Garland, past hwy 78/past the Firewheel Mall. Exit at Merritt/Liberty Grove Connector. At <u>2nd</u> stop sign (Liberty Grove), turn left. Drive 1.7 miles. Turn left at Waterview Pkwy, leads to golf course on left. If driving through downtown Dallas on I-30, proceed east of LBJ Frwy (635), Garland, and exit at Geo Bush Turnpike (north). Exit the Turnpike at Lakeview Pkwy/Main St. /Hwy 66. Stay on the Service Road, passing Main St., passing Hwy 66 for another 1.4 miles. Turn right at the stop sign (Liberty Grove). Drive 1.7 miles. Turn left at Waterview Pkwy, leads to golf course on left.

Feb. 24 <u>Buffalo Creek</u> (Heath) 972-771-4003; 624 Country Club Dr. Drive the George Bush Turnpike east/south (it ends at I-30). Merge onto I-30 <u>east</u>. Go across lake, exit at Horizon Rd. Turn right, drive across Ridge Rd. (traffic light). Immediately past hospital, turn right onto Tubbs Rd. (7-11 store on left). Road changes name to White Rd. Wind through residential area paralleling golf course. At the stop sign (Country Club Rd.) turn left. Drive ½ mile, course entrance on right.

### **TEE BOXES:**

The Association uses 2 tee boxes in an attempt to make the rounds most enjoyable for all members. Tee off is usually from the white/red tees, announced by the Tournament Chairman prior to commencing play. Members 75 years of age or older may tee off from the forward tees. Members less than 75 years of age with a handicap of 18 or greater may tee off from the forward tees and must remain on that tee box for a minimum of 6 months. ## **MORE SAD NEWS:**



NTSGA has recently learned of the passing of longtime loyal member, Harold Lockman on July 4, 2020. Harold played with the organization for 5 years and during that time played in approximately 50 tournaments a year. He shot his age almost every week and did so an incredible 1043 times during all of his golfing days. This is one of the highest numbers of times a golfer has shot his/her age in the United States. Harold recorded 5 Holes-in-One while playing golf and in 2005 played an astonishing 411 rounds of golf. He was 86 years old at the time of passing.

#### **MORE SAD NEWS:**

Former member Ted Rickenbacher passed away Jan. 2. He played golf with NTSGA during 2019. He graduated from TCU with a degree in journalism and spent his entire life in the newspaper business continuing as the 4<sup>th</sup> generation of newspaper publishers. Ted started many north Texas newspapers including the Farmers Branch Times, Carrollton Chronicle, Lewisville Times and Addison Times-Chronicle. He owned Rickenbacher Media and brokered the sale of 130 newspapers and magazines all over the country including sales to the Dallas Morning News and Ft. Worth Star Telegram. During Ted's golfing days he made two holes-in-one and



won the Bent Tree Seniors Club Championship. He was the great grandson of Eddie Rickenbacher, the founder of Eastern Airlines.

It is the responsibility of the Captain to check off (✓,x) all listed partners for the tournament. If a partner does not show up for that event and the fee has been paid, that team will be carried over until the next tournament (highlighted in yellow on the computer sign up pages). If a Captain wants to play with a partner that is not on his list, enter the team on the manual sign up page and pay the \$2.00 entry fee. If a member does not want to be a Captain, simply tell 2-man Team Coordinator, **Mike Robertson** (214-505-1814) and his name will be removed from the Captain's listing.

# **UNUSUAL BUNKER RULE:**

The new rules adopted by the USGA and the R&A allows a golfer to lift his ball out of a bunker and place it within 2 club lengths from the front of the bunker on the line that it entered the bunker, to play his next shot. The golfer incurs a 2 stroke penalty if he elects to lift his ball out of the bunker. If you are confronted with a buried lie under the lip of a bunker, this little known USGA rule may be the prudent thing to do.

## LATE CANCELLATIONS...

Late cancellations cause much frustration for Tournament Chairman **Rod Wells**. A late cancellation is anytime after the 12:00 noon sign up deadline, 2 days before a tournament. (Usually 12:00 noon, Monday). After that time he puts together the pairing sheet for the upcoming event. A late cancellation creates the necessity to move a player(s) to another group, change cart assignments all while trying to keep players with similar handicaps together. He understands that emergencies arise and sometimes a late cancellation cannot be avoided, but it would help immensely if he knows of a cancellation well before the signup deadline.
