DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

May 5 Fossil Creek (Ft. Worth) 817-847-1900; 3401 Clubgate Dr. Drive Hwy 183 W, transition to 820 W., exit at North Beach, Right turn. Drive to 3rd traffic light, (Fossil Creek Blvd.) Turn left, drive approx. 1 ¼ miles, right turn at Sandshell Dr. Club approx. ½ mi. on right. Or...take Geo Bush Turnpike to Hwy 183 West (Airport Frwy) towards Ft.Worth. Drive approx 11 miles, transition to 820 West and drive another 6 miles to I-35<u>W</u>. At I-35W drive north, and take the 1st exit (Western Center Blvd). Take the 1st quick exit at Sandshell Dr. (Chili's Rest. on right) Course entrance .2 miles on left.

May 12 <u>Grapevine</u> (Grapevine) Drive west on LBJ freeway (I-635) towards DFW airport. Prior to the airport entry, exit at Bass Pro Dr., continue to the traffic light. Turn left, drive over Hwy 121, past the Embassy Suites Hotel to the next traffic light (Hwy 26). Turn left, drive ½ mile to next traffic light, turn right (Fairway Dr.) Drive past Cowboys Golf Club and over the Lake Grapevine Dam. On the other side of the Dam, turn right into golf course entrance.

May 19 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2nd exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.

May 26 <u>Trails of Frisco</u> (Frisco) 972-668-4653; 10411 Teel Pkwy. Take Dallas Tollway north, past Sam Rayburn Tollway (Hwy 121) approx 5 miles, exit at Main St. (FM 720). Turn left (west) drive 1 ½ miles, right turn at Teel Pkwy., course 3/4 mile on left.

June 2 <u>Waterchase</u> (Arlington) 817-861-4653; 8951 Creek Run Rd. Take I-30 westbound, past the Rangers Ballpark, exit at Eastchase Pkwy., right turn to 2nd traffic light. (John T. White Rd.) Turn right for 1 block. Right turn at Randol Mill Rd., drive ½ mile, left turn at Creek Run Rd., (alongside apt. complex), course ½ mile on left.

2021 MASTERS POT...



Day 1 weather conditions were ideal with little wind and sunny skies. With no recent rain in the Augusta area, the greens were slick, mowed very tight and were sure to make low scores a rarity.

This was the largest number of selections made by NTSGA members in 10 years (126 selections). The favorites were typically the golfers who were playing well in recent weeks including Jordan Spieth, Justin Thomas, Dustin Johnson and Bryson DeChambeau. After Day 1, distancing himself from the field was Justin Rose who shot a sparkling 65 to lead all golfers. This made **Jeff Aston** very happy as he was the only member selecting Rose as one of his combo picks. The shouting could be easily heard coming all the way from **Jeff's** home in Wills Point. This however, is not an individual event, but the best combined finish by 2 golfers.

Day 2 had little wind, but clouds rolled in and the course seemed more receptive to the pro's approach shots and putts. Sadly, the course got the better of three favorites including Dustin Johnson, Brooks Koepka and Rory McIlroy. Missing the cut by these three big names knocked out 69 of the 126 selections by NTSGA members. **Jeff Aston** was still elated as his choice of Justin Rose was still leading the tournament at the half-way point. Other NTSGA members who looked awfully good with their selections were **Dick Hall, Jerry Walker, Jack Tanis, Mike Vestal, Howie Bacharach** and **Frank Arnold.**

Round 3 began under cloudy skies with the seasoned veteran, Justin Rose paired with the tour rookie, Will Zalatoris (who grew up in Plano) for the final grouping of the day. In mid-round, a 1 hour rain delay softened the greens and players began firing at pins as the greens were now receptive to approach shots. Hideki Matsuyama played brilliant shots as he distanced himself from the field by recording birdie, birdie, eagle, birdie, birdie in 5 of his last 8 holes. He finished the day 4 strokes ahead of the closest pursuer. This made **Joe Bob Wheeler** and **Roger Nondorf** very happy as both had Matsuyama as ½ of their combo selections.

Sunday's final round began with Hideki Matsuyama leading the field by 4 strokes. A bogey at #1 by Matsuyama and back to back birdies by rookie Will Zalatoris, the lead was now only 1 stroke. On a beautiful weather day in Augusta, Matsuyama played steady golf increasing his lead to 5 strokes. No one got closer than 4 strokes until #15 when Matsuyama hit long into the water. Xander Schauffele made birdie and suddenly the Matsuyama lead was only 2 and the back side drama of Sunday afternoon was starting to take shape. It came to an abrupt end, however when Schauffele hit his ball into the water on #16 giving Matsuyama breathing room. The biggest move on Sunday afternoon was made by Jon Rahm, to the delight of 16 NTSGA members.

The winner of this year's Master's Pool was **Ollie Cromwell** (Jordan Spieth T3 & Xander Schauffele T3); \$378.00. Splitting 2nd and 3rd place money: **Dick Hall/Frank Arnold** (Xander Schauffele T3 & Jon Rahm 5); \$63.00 and **Bill Lambert/Tom Hatfield** (Jordan Spieth T3 & Jon Rahm 5); \$63.00.

SAD NEWS:

Former NTSGA President Joe Thompson passed away on April 26th. He joined the organization in 1988 and resigned because of health reasons in 2018. He served the NTSGA office of President, Vice President and Past President from 2008-2012. Joe served proudly in the U.S. Army seeing combat action during the Korean War. His civilian life consisted of working for The Borden Company, an American producer of food and beverage products, the country's largest producer of dairy and pasta products. In addition, Joe worked for Huntington Laboratory, a company providing quality natural supplements and vitamins for better health. He was a soft



spoken true gentleman and a valued member of NTSGA for 30 years. He was 88 years old at the time of passing.

NTSGA RULES REFRESHER....PUTTING

A coin or flat object should be placed directly behind the ball before it is picked up and cleaned. If necessary to move the marker because it rests in another golfers putting line, the club head distance is taken from the marker, not the ball. Remember to replace the moved marker before setting the ball back on the green. The one club rule cannot be used to move the ball from the fringe/rough onto the putting surface. All putts <u>must</u> be holed out. There are no gimme putts. If you pick up and do not complete a hole, you have effectively withdrawn from the round and are ineligible to win flight prize money, skins or closest to the pin payouts.



SCORECARDS...

The pre-printed scorecards are furnished by the Tournament Chairman or the Handicap Chairman and placed on the appropriate carts prior to the carts leaving to begin the day's tournament. It is the responsibility of 1 member of the foursome to turn the card into the Scoring Committee upon completion of the round. At Buffalo Creek, 1 scorecard was missing after the Committee entered all of the scores into the computer. One of the Scoring Committee members re-visited the carts that had been used by NTSGA members during the round on Apr. 28th and found the missing scorecard still clipped onto the steering wheel. It is not the job of the Scoring Committee to track down missing scorecards. It is the responsibility of one member of the foursome to deliver the card to the Scoring Committee, in the clubhouse following the completion of the round. If not, the foursome will be disqualified from that tournament.
