DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES...

Aug. 3 <u>Prairie Lakes</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-263-0661; 3202 SE 14th St. Drive I-35 southbound, take the Loop 12 split towards Irving. Drive approx. 10 miles south, then take Spur 408 for about 1½ miles and make a right turn onto Hwy 303 driving west over Mountain Creek Lake. On the other side of the lake, turn left @ SE 14th St. (traffic light). Course entrance approx. ½ mile on left.

Aug. 10 <u>Woodbridge</u> (Wylie) 972-429-5100 7400 Country Club Dr. Drive the Geo Bush Turnpike, exit at Hwy 78 (north) in Garland. Drive 3.9 miles; turn right into the Woodbridge subdivision. At 2nd stop sign, turn left. Course entrance .2 miles, straight ahead.

Aug. 17 Sky Creek Ranch (Keller) 817-498-1414; 600 Promontory Dr. Drive LBJ Frwy towards DFW Airport, take Hwy 121 south (it goes south for ½ mile, and then turns west). At the Hwy 121/114 split, bear right towards Bridgeport, exit at Southlake Blvd. Turn left, drive 4.9 miles. Left turn at Randol Mill (Dunkin' Donuts on left, Shell station on right). Randol Mill turns into Davis Blvd. in a few blocks. Drive .9 miles to 2nd traffic light. Right turn at Bear Creek Pkwy. Drive 1.4 miles through residential area. Watch for small sign to Sky Creek Ranch. Right turn at Promontory Dr., leads to club.

Aug. 22 <u>Diamond Oaks C.C.</u> (Ft. Worth) 817-834-6261; 5821 Diamond Oaks Dr. N. Drive the George Bush Turnpike south, merging onto Hwy 183 west. Drive 15 miles west. Hwy 183 becomes I-820 west. Past Iron Horse Blvd., exit at Hwy 377 (Denton Hwy). Turn left and drive south on Hwy 377 for 1 mile. Turn left at Diamond Oaks Dr. Road bends to the right, Club entrance is on left.

Aug. 24 <u>Bridlewood</u> (Flower Mound) 972-355-4800; 4000 W. Windsor Dr. Proceed north on I-35E, exit at FM1171/Main St. (Lewisville). Turn left (west), drive 5 ½ miles, right turn at Bridlewood Blvd. At 1st stop sign, turn right, course entrance on left.

Aug. 31 <u>Watters Creek</u> (Allen) -517-7777; 7201 Chase Oaks Blvd. Drive I-75 (Central Expwy). Exit at Legacy Dr., turn west. At 2nd traffic light, (Chase Oaks Blvd) turn right. Course ½ mile on left.

2022 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP POT

This year's Open Championship would be played at the Holy Grail of Golf...St. Andrews, hard by the North Sea in Scotland. This is the birthplace of golf and a severe test for the best golfers in the world. NTSGA members made 91 combo selections in hopes of winning the Pot for this year's final major golf tournament.



Weather conditions on Scotland's coast can be fickle and would surely test the games of all 156 players. The most popular selections were understandably: Jordan Spieth, Xander Schauffele, Rory McIlroy and Scottie Scheffler. Cool weather conditions usually prevail when playing this majestic golf course as wind, crispy greens and pot bunkers make for tough conditions for the pros. Unheralded Cameron Young led after Round 1 finishing at 8 under par.

Friday weather conditions were sunny with no wind but the humps, bumps, speedy greens, high gorse and treacherous bunkers would force the pro's to play conservative, smart shots in an attempt to make the cut.

Cam Smith played beautifully, finishing Round 2 at 13 under par; the lowest score at the halfway point of all 150 Open Championships. Failure to make the cut at the tournament mid-point cost 14 NTSGA selections to be eliminated.

Round 3 began with light winds and sunny skies but clouds rolled in, forcing spectators and players to don jackets for the remainder of the round. Rory McIlroy seized the lead of this Championship following a chip-in from a pot bunker for eagle and the lead, passing Viktor Hovland, Cam Young, Si Who Kim, Scottie Scheffler and Cam Smith. Excitement was building at the homes of NTSGA golfers: **Bucky Taylor, Gene Lindsey**, **Dave Patrick** and **Bill Roll** as all had golfer selections near the top of the leaderboard.

On the back nine of this major championship, during the final round, Cameron Smith caught fire and made 5 birdies in a row and another birdie on the home hole which was just enough to defeat Cameron Young who would record an eagle on the 18th hole. Smith recorded the lowest tournament score ever (-20) on this fabled golf course, shooting a sparkling 64 and becoming the 2022 Champion Golfer of the Year.

Five year member, **Bob King** recorded his 2nd lifetime Hole-In-One on June 29 at

Texas Star. Both of Bob's aces were made while playing with NTSGA, his first one recorded Jan. 31, 2018 at WestRidge. Bob used his 6 iron (the same club he used at WestRidge) on the uphill par 3, #3 hole at Texas Star while playing with Kelly Jackson, Bob Lewis and Mike Robertson. Measuring 118 yards, none of the foursome saw the ball roll into the hole as the pin was positioned behind a bunker. Bob grew up in Dallas, attending North Dallas High School and Collin County Community College before starting work with Texas Instruments and later E Systems. Before retiring,



Bob worked for Unitron, a leading manufacturer of solid state ground power conversion equipment for aerospace and marine industries for military and commercial companies. WARM UP.....

Prior to a tournament, your warm-up time on the range should only be about 15-20 balls. You're not there for a lengthy practice session.....you're there to get loose prior to playing 18 holes. Please be courteous of other members waiting to warm up prior to their round. Your goal isn't to hit 2-3 buckets of balls, but rather a warm up session designed to loosen some stiff muscles. Other members are waiting patiently to do the same thing. Thank you.

As I watch this generation try and rewrite history, I'm sure of one thing: It will be misspelled and have no punctuation!

HARD CAP, SOFT CAP:

Several members have asked about the hard cap and soft cap that Handicap Chairman **Howie Bacharach** uses to compute the NTSGA handicaps. It's a complicated system but it aligns with the World Handicap System, USGA and now our organization. It tracks the lowest golf handicap index calculated for a player during a rolling 12 month period and is incorporated into the NTSGA computer software program. If a newly calculated index goes up more than 3.0 strokes from the lowest index during the previous 12 months, the "soft cap" goes into effect. With the "soft cap" in place and the golfers index goes up by 5.0 strokes, the "hard cap" goes into effect which prevents any further increase in the player's index. A player must have at least 20 rounds of acceptable scores before the soft cap/hard cap computation becomes relevant. There is no limit on the amount by which a player's Handicap Index can decrease, but the soft cap/hard cap will ensure that a temporary loss of form does not cause a player's Handicap Index to increase to a level inconsistent with their demonstrated ability.

Handicap Chairman **Howie Bacharach** has spent considerable time learning this confusing method of calculation, but is willing to discuss the intricacies of this system to NTSGA members. Howie can be reached at 972-620-2602.
