DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES...

June 1 <u>Waterchase</u> (Arlington) 817-861-4653; 8951 Creek Run Rd. Take I-30 westbound, past the Rangers Ballpark, exit at Eastchase Pkwy., right turn to 2nd traffic light. (John T. White Rd.) Turn right for 1 block. Right turn at Randol Mill Rd., drive ½ mile, left turn at Creek Run Rd., (alongside apt. complex), course ½ mile on left.

June 8 Sky Creek Ranch (Keller) 817-498-1414; 600 Promontory Dr. Drive LBJ Frwy towards DFW Airport, take Hwy 121 south (it goes south for ½ mile, and then turns west). At the Hwy 121/114 split, bear right towards Bridgeport, exit at Southlake Blvd. Turn left, drive 4.9 miles. Left turn at Randol Mill (Dunkin' Donuts on left, Shell station on right). Randol Mill turns into Davis Blvd. in a few blocks. Drive .9 miles to 2nd traffic light. Right turn at Bear Creek Pkwy. Drive 1.4 miles through residential area. Watch for small sign to Sky Creek Ranch. Right turn at Promontory Dr., leads to club.

June 15 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2nd exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.

June 22 <u>Heritage Ranch</u> (Fairview) 972-549-0276; 465 Scenic Ranch Circle. Take US-75 (Central Expwy) north, exit at Stacy Rd., right turn (east) 3 miles to the dead end (FM 1378). Turn left, then an immediate right, back onto Stacy Rd. Continue east for ½ mile, course entrance on left (gated community with guard shack).

June 29 <u>Texas Star</u> (Euless) 817-685-7888; 1400 Texas Star Pkwy. Take Hwy 183 (Airport Frwy) west, past the south entrance to DFW Airport. Exit at Hwy 10 West (it becomes Euless Blvd.) Continue on Hwy 10, passing Hwy 157 (Industrial Blvd.) for 1 more mile. Course entrance on left.

WEATHER CANCELLATIONS.....

All members should get in the habit of checking the website (ntsga.org) the evening before a golf tournament and early morning before leaving for the golf course, for possible messages scrolling across the website from the Tournament Chairman regarding weather conditions/delays and/or cancellations. This procedure has now been enhanced by linking member's cell phones to receive this early morning cancellation message. CLOSEST TO THE PIN MARKERS...

At the Mansfield Nat'l tournament, one of the Closest to the Pin markers was left on the course after the round. When this happens, a member of the Scoring Committee has to drive out to the hole to retrieve the marker. This is time consuming and adds another 30 minutes to the Scoring Committee's time at the course. This should never happen. If your foursome ends the round at a par 3 hole...bring the marker to the clubhouse. The pre-printed scorecard actually directs you to do this by a reminder on the scorecard. The next time this delinquency occurs, we're gonna name names. Thank you.

2022 PGA CHAMPIONSHIP POT:

This year's PGA Championship was played at Southern Hills C.C. in Tulsa under warm temperatures. Sixty nine selections were made by NTSGA members in a quest to win this Championship Pot. It was not unusual that many local DFW golfers were favorites to win this Championship, including Scottie Scheffler, Will Zalatoris and Jordan Spieth who were 40 of the member's combo selections.



After Round 1 the leader was Rory McIlroy to the delight of 8 NTSGA members after McIlroy recorded a sparkling 65.

Weather conditions on Day 2 were similar to the opening round as Texas golfers made their way to the top of the leaderboard. Texas Tech alumni Mito Pereira made 7 birdies as he slid into second place behind the leader, Will Zalatoris a Dallas resident who was the tournament leader following Round 2. The cut was made after this round and 5 of the favorites selected by NTSGA golfers would not be playing on the weekend including the overall favorite Scottie Scheffler who was on 28 combo selections of NTSGA golfers. Thirty five of the 69 selections were now out of the running for this year's PGA Championship Pot.

Round 3 produced chilly, windy conditions and had Mito Pereira vaulting to the top of the leaderboard, passing the halfway leader, Will Zalatoris. Most of the cheering was coming from NTSGA golfer's residences, mainly **Gene Lindsey, Frank Arnold, Bill Roll** and **David Tovar**. Two Texas golfers could be battling for the win on Sunday, but could someone come for way behind and overtake the leaders?

Mito Pereira led the tournament Sunday afternoon until the final hole when he hit his drive into a creek, had to settle for double bogey and cost him a position in a 3-hole aggregate playoff. The playoff would be between veteran Justin Thomas and an untested newcomer Will Zalatoris. Both birdied the 1st playoff hole in front of enormous crowds attending this major championship. One more birdie and a par by Justin Thomas earned him the Championship after beginning the final round 7 strokes behind the leaders.

These are the only contacts to use early in the morning if you are having trouble getting to the golf course.

MEMORIES OF FOSSIL CREEK:

Many members voiced their displeasure with the positioning of the hole on the 8th hole when we played the course on April 28. Combined...all members recorded 750 strokes on that hole, averaging 7.6 strokes/ player. When brought to the attention of the Pro Shop, the Pro apologized for the unfortunate positioning of the pin on that hole.

CHEATING:

Cheating has reared its ugly head again. Word has filtered back to NTSGA Officers that some foursomes have taken a very liberal attitude when it comes to following the guidelines and rules set forth by our By-Laws. Golf is an honorable game and we trust that all NTSGA golfers are honorable players. We expect an honorable and accurate counting of all strokes taken on each hole. We play for a small amount of money and it is only fair to all players in the field, to submit correct scores on the scorecard. NTSGA rules are intentionally lax to allow the golfer to lift, clean and place a ball within 1 club length from its original lie before executing the next shot, except in a bunker or hazard. There are no "gimme" putts. When the rules were established years ago, they were fashioned to make it fun, but challenging for senior golfers. These rules can be viewed on the NTSGA website "By-Laws" tab. There are no impartial referees in our game of golf, so the golfer and the other members of the foursomes are responsible for recording the exact score on all 18 holes. This does not mean that a partner's correction for a misstated score is to be taken as a personal affront; it is simply an important part of maintaining the game's integrity and honorable status to protect all 128 competitors.

If the relaxed rules established by the NTSGA organization are not to your liking, the officer's will accept your resignation as there are many golfers waiting to join NTSGA.
