DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES:

June 7 Watters Creek (Allen) 972-517-7777; 7201 Chase Oaks Blvd. Drive I-75 (Central Expwy). Exit at Legacy Dr., turn west. At 2nd traffic light, (Chase Oaks Blvd) turn right. Course ½ mile on left.

June 14 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2nd exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.

June 21 <u>Texas Star</u> (Euless) 817-685-7888; 1400 Texas Star Pkwy. Take Hwy 183 (Airport Frwy) west, past the south entrance to DFW Airport. Exit at Hwy 10 West (it becomes Euless Blvd.) Continue on Hwy 10, passing Hwy 157 (Industrial Blvd.) for 1 more mile. Course entrance on left.

June 28 <u>Tenison - Highlands</u> (Dallas) 214-670-1402; 3501 Samuell Blvd. Drive east of downtown Dallas on I-30, exit at Dolphin Rd., turn left, under I-30 for 1 block, right turn on Samuell Blvd. Then a left turn at Tenison Parkway, course entrance on right.

SLOW PLAY-

Slow play is defined as any foursome that is not keeping up with the foursome ahead of them. This is regardless of whether the group ahead of them is waiting. One issue that the Board of Directors suspects is slowing play is the extended use of on course laser range finders. If required to keep carts on paths during wet conditions, take several clubs to your ball along with the range finder to avoid making two separate trips. These tips will also help speed the pace of play:

Don't take 4 practice swings before striking the ball; you warmed up on the driving range.

Don't wait until it's your turn to putt to determine which way your putt breaks. You should've done that when walking onto the green or while others are putting. Play ready golf, even in the fairway.

Walk briskly to/from the green.

2023 PGA CHAMPIONSHIP POT...

This years' PGA Championship would be played at the Oak Hill C.C. outside of Rochester, NY. Obviously, springtime had not yet arrived in the northeast as Thursday's tee off temperature was 37 degrees. Player's were bundled up in stocking caps, sweaters, mittens, jackets and carried hand warmers. Sixty five selections were made by NTSGA golfers



in hopes of winning this year's PGA Championship pot. Most popular amongst those selections were favorites and players playing well recently: Scottie Scheffler, Jon Rahm, Tony Finau and Rory McIlroy. The course would be a tough test as the weather forecast was for cold rain and thick rough around the course. Dallas' own Scottie Scheffler played superb golf and was tied at the top with Dustin Johnson and Corey Conners at the end of Round 1.

Round 2 was delayed 2 hours as freezing temperatures and frost on the greens prevented the players from starting their rounds. Scotty Scheffler again played steady golf and was tied at the top with Corey Conners and Viktor Hovland at the end of the round. Even though Hovland finished tied for 7th at The Masters, not one NTSGA golfer had him as one of their combo selections. Brooks Koepke made a charge toward the lead with a sparkling 66 under tough weather conditions. SMU's Bryson DeChambeau found himself only 2 strokes behind the leaders. Wet weather and tough scoring conditions knocked out 18 selections made by NTSGA golfers in this year's PGA Championship pot.

Saturday's round was wet, as expected, under the cloak of colorful umbrellas, but the golfers played well under the toughest conditions. Brooks Koepka surged to the top of the leaderboard followed by Corey Conners, Viktor Hovland, Bryson DeChambeau, Justin Rose and Scottie Scheffler. Excitement was building in the households of **Bobby Tutor, Jack Martin, Jalil Daneshfar, Gene Edmondson and Bill Lambert** as their combo selections were close to the top and could possibly win this year's PGA Championship Pot.

Final round weather was perfect...sunshine, little wind and a perfect day for shooting a low score and five golfers did just that shooting 65's, but no one could catch eventual winner, Brooks Koepka who notched his 5th major victory. The PGA Championship Pot winner was **Bill Lambert**: Brooks Koepka (1) & Scottie Scheffler (T2), \$195.00. Second place was **Jack Martin**: Scottie Scheffler (T2) & Rory McIlroy (T7), \$81.00. Third place was **Frank Arnold**: Brooks Koepka (1) & Cam Smith (T9), \$49.00. The next NTSGA Major Pot will be the US Open. Selections can be made at Tierra Verde on June 14.
