DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES...

Mar. 6 <u>Tenison Park-Highlands</u> (Dallas) 214-670-1402; 3501 Samuell Blvd. Drive east of downtown Dallas on I-30, exit at Dolphin Rd., turn left , under I-30 for 1 block, right turn on Samuell Blvd. Then a left turn at Tenison Parkway, course entrance on right.

Mar. 13 <u>Golf Club of Dallas</u> (Dallas) 214-333-3595; 2200 W. Redbird Ln. From downtown Dallas, drive south on I-35E. Approx 4.4 miles, bear right onto Hwy 67 (towards Cleburne). In approx. 2.2 miles, exit at Hampton Rd. Turn left (under Hwy 67). At 2nd traffic light (Red Bird Ln.) turn left, course entrance .1 mile on right.

Mar. 20 <u>Grapevine</u> (Grapevine) 817-410-3377; Drive west on LBJ freeway (I-635) towards DFW airport. Prior to the airport entry, exit at Bass Pro Dr., continue to the traffic light. Turn left, drive over Hwy 121, past the Embassy Suites Hotel to the next traffic light (Hwy 26). Turn left, drive ½ mile to next traffic light, turn right (Fairway Dr.) Drive past Cowboys Golf Club and over the Lake Grapevine Dam. On the other side of the Dam, turn right into golf course entrance.

Mar. 27 <u>Buffalo Creek</u> (Rockwall) 972-771-4003; 624 Country Club Dr. Drive the George Bush Turnpike east/south (it ends at I-30). Merge onto I-30 <u>east</u>. Go across lake, exit at Horizon Rd. Turn right, drive across Ridge Rd. (traffic light). Immediately past hospital, turn right onto Tubbs Rd. (7-11 store on left). Road changes name to White Rd. as it winds through residential area paralleling golf course. At the stop sign (Country Club Rd.) turn left. Drive ¼ mile, course entrance on right.


DROPS:

With warmer weather and members anxious to play golf, we expect to have very active participation in our tournaments. When more than 128 members sign up to play, **Tournament Chairman Rod Wells** must randomly drop members to bring the number down to 128. Rod emails the member's who have been dropped, after he finalizes the pairing's (usually by 2 PM, 2 days before the event). If you are uncertain if you have been forced to sit out a tournament, check the website (ntsga.org) on Monday night or sometime Tuesday...that's if the event is scheduled on Wednesday. Click on the Sign-Up tab, scroll down and click on "Next Round Sign-Up Lists". All sign-up names will be listed in alphabetical order. On the far right side in <u>red</u>, will be written "Dropped", if you have been excluded from that event. It is very easy to see if you are/are not scheduled to play in that tournament.

RULES REVIEW:

NTSGA golfers may improve their lie by 1 club length (using the longest club in the bag), but never closer to the hole. The ball must remain in the <u>same cut of grass</u>. If the ball is in the fringe of the green, it may be improved by 1 club length, but must remain in the fringe, no closer to the hole. If a ball trickles off the fairway into a pond or lake and is partially submerged in the water, it may be played out of the water as it lies (not a very prudent decision!) without a penalty stroke. Or, it may be lifted from the water and dropped 2 club lengths from its water position onto the grass, in line with were it



entered the penalty area. The golfer will incur a 1 stroke penalty. The ball may also be lifted from the water and dropped anywhere along the line that the errant shot entered the water, going as far back as the golfer desires and dropping the ball (also incurring a 1 stroke penalty). The one club length rule can <u>never</u> be used to re-position a ball from the water's edge onto the fairway without incurring a 1 stroke penalty. The NTSGA Rules of Tournament Play are on the By-Laws tab of the NTSGA website.
