

DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES...

Oct. 2 <u>Bridlewood</u> (Flower Mound) 972-355-4800; 4000 W. Windsor Dr. Proceed north on I-35E, exit at FM1171/Main St. (Lewisville). Turn left (west), drive 5 ½ miles, right turn at Bridlewood Blvd. At 1st stop sign, turn right, course entrance on left.

Oct. 9 Irving Golf Club (Irving) 972-457-0772 2000 E.Shady Grove Rd. Drive I-35E, bear right to get on Loop 12 South towards Irving. Pass Hwy 183 and drive 2 ½ miles south. Exit at Shady Grove, turn left, course entrance on right.

Oct. 16 <u>Tangleridge</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-299-6837; 818 Tangle Ridge Dr. Take I-35E south thru downtown Dallas. Bear right at the Hwy 67 split, towards Cleburne. After passing under I-20, drive 8.7 miles, exit at Lake Ridge Pkwy., right turn, drive 2 miles. Turn left at Park Ridge Dr. (traffic light), follow signs through residential area for approx. 1.2 miles to golf course entrance. Or, drive south on the George Bush Turnpike through Arlington towards I-20. Exit at Lake Ridge Parkway (the exit before I20) and continue south for approx 8.5 miles. After crossing 2nd bridge, drive .8 mile turning right at the traffic light to enter the Tangleridge residential area. Drive approx. 1.2 miles (go past elementary school). Turn right at Park Ridge Ct. Leads to golf course.

Oct. 23 <u>Mansfield National</u> (Mansfield) 817-477-3366; 3750 National Pkwy. Take I-20 westbound, exit at Hwy 360. Drive south approximately 8 miles. Exit at Heritage Pkwy. At the traffic light, turn left. Course straight ahead.

Oct. 30 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2nd exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.

EXCESSIVE SIGN-UPS: Sometimes more than the maximum number of players (128) sign up for our tournaments. When this happens, **Tournament Chairman Rod Wells** uses a computer selected random list of all members and has to call the number of members in excess of 128. He informs them that they will not be able to play in that event. (NTSGA By-Laws Article VI, Section 5). Don't feel as if you're being picked upon, as you will not be excluded from a tournament again until all 240 members have been screened and forced to sit out an event. Sometimes, someone comes into your life and out of nowhere, makes your heart race and changes you forever...we call those people cops!

SCORECARDS:

Scorecards are used to record the golfers score on each hole. They are used by the PGA, LPGA, Senior Tour and NTSGA. A numerical number must be placed in the proper square alongside each player's name showing the score he made on all 18 holes. NTSGA scores are used to determine 2-man team winners, skins winners and flight payout money awarded to winning members. If you keep side bets amongst the foursome, these notations should be recorded on the course scorecard provided by the pro-shop and not on the pre-printed scorecard provide by the NTSGA Tournament Chairman. The Scoring Committee must convert these notations (+,0,-) into actual scores before entering into the computer for all 18 holes. This method of scorekeeping is time consuming and unacceptable and in the future will result in disqualification of the foursome. This is a backup article to the email sent to all members on this subject by **Handicap/Technology Chairman, Howie Bacharach.**

WEATHER CANCELLATIONS.....

All members should get in the habit of checking the website (ntsga.org) the evening before a golf tournament and early morning before leaving for the golf course for possible messages from the Tournament Chairman regarding weather conditions/delays and/or cancellations. This procedure has now been enhanced by linking member's cell phones to receive this early morning cancellation message. To link your phone, contact **Technology Chm./Webmaster Howie Bacharach** (hbacharach@aol.com) and provide your mobile phone number and the name of your wireless carrier.

NTSGA RULES REVIEW: NTSGA adheres to USGA rules with exceptions to allow for more favorable playing conditions and the enjoyment of all members. One rule that seems to be violated is pertaining to bunker play. If a ball rests in wet sand and the bunker has areas of dry sand, the ball may be lifted, dry sand raked and ball <u>dropped</u> in the raked sand. The ball should be <u>dropped</u> from knee height and not placed on the dry sand. Pebbles, rocks, leaves, twigs, grass, etc. may now be removed from a bunker without penalty under the rule changes of 2019. If there are <u>no dry areas</u> in the bunker, <u>drop</u> the ball in front of the bunker within one club length from the front edge of the bunker in line where the ball lay and the hole, no closer to the hole. There is no penalty. The bunker should be between the player and the green. The other playing partners should agree on the correct action to be taken if a ball is to be repositioned.

FUNNY ????

A seven year old boy was at the center of a Dallas courtroom drama, when he challenged a court ruling over who should have custody of him.

The boy has a history of being beaten by his parents and the judge initially awarded custody to his Aunt, in keeping with child custody laws and regulations requiring that family unity be maintained to the highest degree possible.
